

## House Plants



### **Chinese Money Plant: *Pilea peperomioides***

Evergreen ornamental from S.W China, very rare in wild. Easy to grow as house plant, away from direct sun.



### **Inch plant: *Tradescantia zebrina***

House plant with unusual, variegated leaves that are green, purple and silver. It has a trailing habit so looks great in a hanging planter or on a shelf. Very easy to grow and tolerant of neglect. Native to Mexico, it thrives in warm temperatures and bright light and can cope with some direct sunshine.



### ***Pelargonium* 'Black Prince'**

A very old Victorian variety, of great beauty; tall, upright plant bearing dark purple flowers edged white with white throat.



### ***Pelargonium sidoides* 'Sloe Gin'**

Unusual species, attractive because of its felted gray crinkled leaves and butterfly-shaped, rich wine-red flowers.



### **Prayer Plant: *Maranta leuconeura***

Tender evergreen perennial. Very special house plant that holds leaves upright in the night, opening out in response to light. Thrives on benign neglect.



***Streptocarpus: Mixed varieties***

Well-known and popular, moderately easy-to-grow houseplants in a range of attractive colours which will produce flowers over several months. Prefer well-lit place but not full sun.
